1) What is the IPPC Plant Health Campus?

The IPPC Plant Health Campus is an online portal offering e-learning courses, guides, and other technical information focused on key phytosanitary systems. Its overall goal is to strengthen national phytosanitary capacity.

The Campus provides free e-learning courses with certification tests that allow learners to earn digital badges and certificates, which can be shared on social media or added to professional profiles.

2) Who can access the e-learning courses, guides and technical information from the IPPC Plant Health Campus?

Anyone interested in plant health can access all e-learning courses, guides and technical information presented on the IPPC Plant Health Campus. The courses are aimed at plant health professionals that work for national plant protection organizations (NPPOs), as well as other government agencies that support plant health activities, Phytosanitary Capacity Evaluation (PCE) facilitators that support NPPOs, as well as growers, exporters, importers to support better understanding of NPPO functions and responsibilities. NPPO staff are encouraged to share these capacity development courses with producers, treatment providers, exporters, importers, non-governmental organizations, and other plant health stakeholders.

The courses can also be accessed by students interested in enhancing their understanding of plant health.

3) How do I access the IPPC e-learning courses from the IPPC Plant Health Campus?

The IPPC Plant Health Campus can be accessed via the IPPC website or through the FAO eLearning Academy website. Here is a link to the IPPC Plant Health Campus: <u>https://elearning.fao.org/course/view.php?id=1255</u> You can take the courses online or download to your desktop to work on the courses offline. However, to earn a digital badge and certificate, you must complete the certification test online.

4) I have completed an e-learning course. How can I earn a digital badge or certificate?

Once you have completed the e-learning courses, whether online or offline, you must log into your account and complete the online certification test for the relevant course. You must score at least 75% to pass and receive a digital badge and certificate, which you can share on social media.

5) How do I track my progress in e-learning courses on the IPPC Plant Health Campus?

To access the courses, you need to create an account with the FAO elearning Academy. Your profile will record your course completion progress and store any certificates and badges you earn.

6) Is registration necessary to access e-learning courses on the IPPC Plant Health Campus?

If you are new to the FAO elearning Academy, you must register and create an account to access IPPC courses.

If you already have an account, you can use your existing login to access the courses.

Once registered, your profile will track your course progress and maintain a record of all earned badges.

7) Once started, am I required to complete an e-learning course in one sitting?

No, the e-learning courses offered on the IPPC Plant Health Campus are self-paced learning tools. You can pause the course and return to it later. The course will store your progress. Additionally, you can take the course as many times as you wish.

8) How can these e-learning courses support students and youth interest in plant health?

NPPOs are encouraged to collaborate with universities, especially those offering plant health-related programs, to incorporate IPPC e-learning courses into their curriculum as mandator y or supplementary learning materials.
