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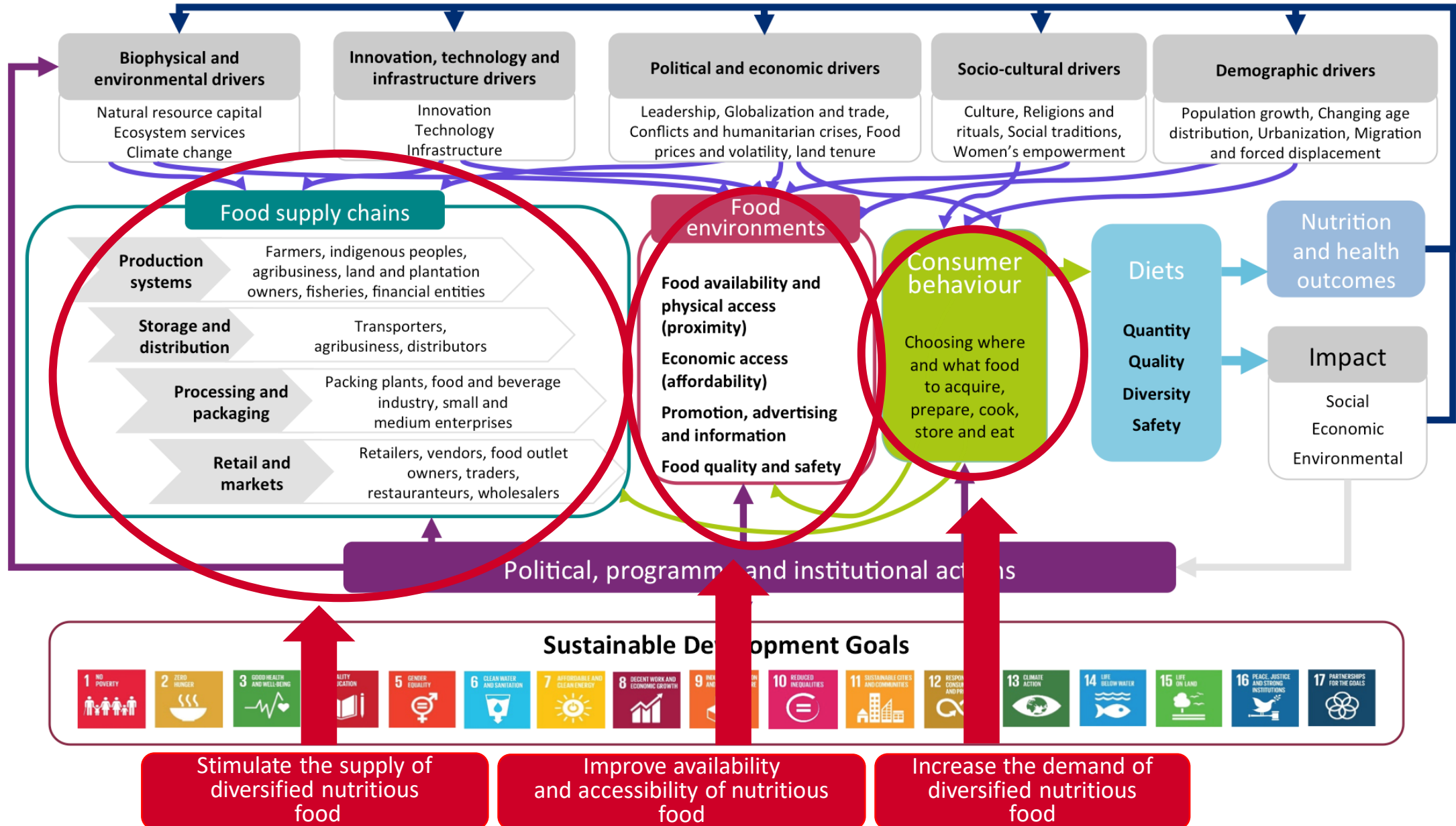

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Why addressing nutrition in sustainable food value chains development?





The Rome-Based Agencies (RBAs) formed, in 2015, a Working Group on Sustainable Food Value Chains for Nutrition to undertake **joint actions** in the following areas:

- Support to **investment** and **policy** processes.
- **Capacity** development.
- Generation of **knowledge** products.
- Harmonized tools and guidance, and joint advocacy, all in the context of **country-led processes** and international policy fora.



Key activities of the RBA Working Group from 2015 to 2017:

- In **2015**: agreement about a framework on Sustainable Food Value Chain For Nutrition (SFVCN).
- In **2016**: dissemination and validation of SFVCN framework through a Special Event organized during a Plenary Meeting of the Committee on World Food Security (CFS), held in Rome in October.
- In **March 2017**: feedback to the framework through an online consultation organized through the Global Forum on Food Security and Nutrition (FSN Forum).



Key activities of the RBA Working Group from 2018 to 2020:

- In 2018, IFAD published the “Nutrition-sensitive value chains: a guide for project design”.
- In 2018 under WFP leadership, the Home-Grown School Feeding (HGSF) Resource Framework was published.
- In 2019 several activities and projects with governments were developed at country level.
- In 2020 under FAO leadership, the joint RBAs e-learning course on SFVCN was published.

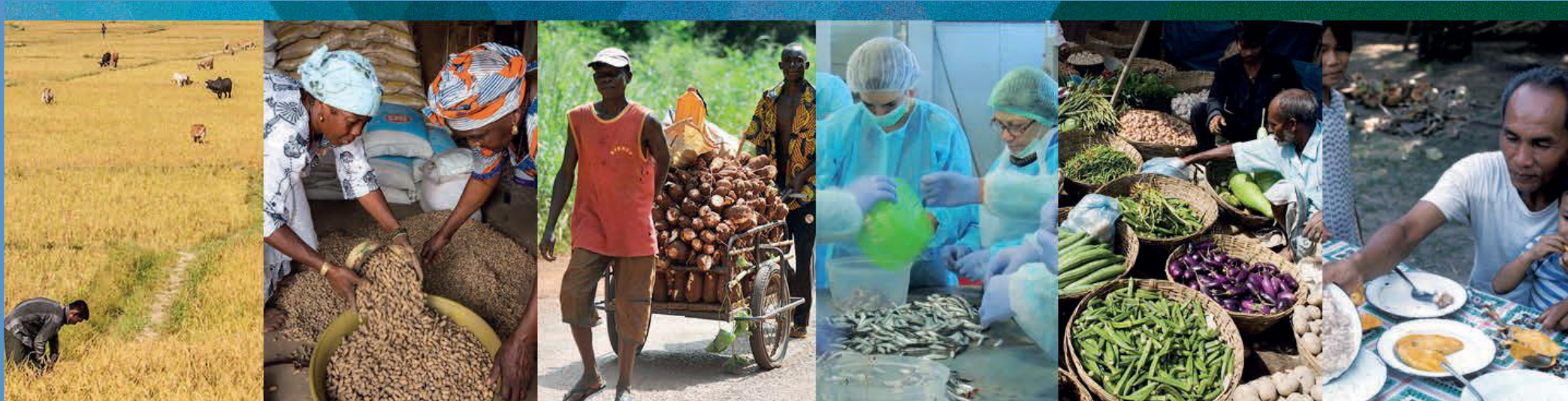
